Beacon Farmers Market

The City of Beacon distributed a Request for Proposals (RFP) on June 8, 2015 seeking a Farmers Market Manager. The deadline for submissions was June 29, 2015, with an addendum extending the deadline until September 10, 2015. The City received three (3) proposals by the September 10, 2015 deadline.

Elemental Events proposed receiving a \$500.00 weekly check from the City of Beacon in exchange for managing the Farmers Market. Beacon Investor Group proposed not charging the City of Beacon in exchange for managing the Farmers Market. Common Ground Farm proposed paying the City of Beacon \$100.00 - \$200.00 rent per month to manage the Farmer's Market.

As of October 1, 2015 I had reviewed all three proposals and interviewed each of the firms. After careful consideration I am recommending awarding the bid to Common Ground Farm. I will also be meeting with the principals of Common Ground to discuss terms and conditions on Tuesday, including vendor fees.

Common Ground Farm has a Board of Directors which is composed of three well qualified individuals with experience in local farm consultation, distribution and retail. They have managed farm market sales for two separate farms. The Board has an extensive network of contacts with local farms and vendors. They plan to accept Electronic Benefit Transfer (EBT) and Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits. They will also hire 1-3 teenagers per year through the Green Teens program to help manage the market. The Board plans to utilize social media as well as signage as part of an enhanced marketing strategy.

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2. OVERVIEW

Background

Common Ground Farm (CGF) is a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization focused on food access and education programs in Beacon and the surrounding communities, with a vision of making local, healthy food available and affordable for everyone. The organization operates a working farm, currently in its 15th season serving the community through broad programmatic partnerships with the Salvation Army soup kitchen, St. Andrews Food Pantry, Fishkill Food Pantry, the Green Teens Mobile Market, the Kids R Kids summer feeding program, the Beacon City School District, Hudson Valley Seed, and several other local organizations. CGF has been a long-standing vendor at the Beacon Farmers Market, and is one of the only vendors that accepts SNAP and EBT cards. In recent years CGF served as a fiscal sponsor for Hudson Valley Seed and Fareground Café, enabling them to function as non profits in our community until officially receiving their 501(c)3 status from NYS.

Farmers Market Management

Common Ground Farm seeks to serve the Beacon community in a greater capacity by taking on the responsibility of managing the Beacon Farmers Market. Three of the members of the CGF Board of Directors are uniquely qualified to lead this effort with a great level of knowledge and experience in local agriculture and Farmers Market management. Ben Giardullo, the President of the Board, is an experienced food systems consultant for local farms, distributors, and retailers. Doug Ornstein worked most of the past 3 years as an Administrative, Finance, and Operations Manager of 26 farmers markets with Down to Earth Farmers Markets. Stephanie Fisher, Vice President of the Board, is the Farmers Market Manager for Bread Alone. With this leadership, the organization will hire a qualified Market Manager, manage all related finances, provide insurance, and pay a monthly rent to the City of Beacon. Our candidate for the Farmers Market Manager, Sarah Mencher, is a Beacon resident currently manages the Cold Spring Farmers Market.

Farmers Market Committee

Although CGF will manage the finances and insurance, the organization will form a community driven Farmers Market Committee to advise on rules, regulations, and vendor selection. The committee will consist of 5 or 7 community members, of which CGF board members will fill 2 or 3 seats, respectively, giving the majority of seats to non-CGF board members. Thus far 2 qualified community members have agreed to be on the committee: Helanna Bratman, the Director of the Green Teens, and Ava Bynum, the Executive Director of Hudson Valley Seed, and the former Farmers Market Manager in Cold Spring.

EBT, Food Stamps, Double Up Coupons

Common Ground Farm has been one of the few vendors accepting EBT cards at the Beacon Farmers Market. The organization will expand this service to serve the entire market. Similar to larger farmers markets, the Market Manager will provide tokens to EBT customers to be redeemed for food products from any vendor at the market. The organization will also apply to qualify as a site for Double Up coupons, where EBT cardholders are granted twice the value for fresh produce purchased with EBT benefits. This is a win-win program whereby EBT cardholders get more fresh, healthy produce, and the farmers gain the additional revenue.

Green Teen Program: CGF and the Green Teens have had a great partnership for the better part of a decade. The organizations plan to create a program for Green Teen graduates to work as assistants to the Farmers Market Manager, and effectively learn how to manage the on-site operations of the market. This will create paid job opportunities for 1-3 teens per year.

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6. MARKETING PLAN

Short-term:

- Instagram and Facebook: 4-8 posts per week (including mid-week posts and Market Day pictures/posts)
- Weekly e-blast sent mid-week to Farm Market subscribers (what's in season, highlight one vendor each week, programming, seasonal recipes, shout outs to business sponsors)
- · Build up Farm Market subscriber list so e-blast is reaching at least 1,000 customers each week
- Weekly posts to Beacon Parents Network when there is children's programming
- Updated signage around town 5 permanent Farm Market signs and a few new day-of signs (i.e. "Farm Market today! waterfront, 10am to 3pm)
- Simple, clear website with lots of photos, information for both customers and vendors, business sponsor names and links, ability to sign-up for weekly e-blast
- "We support the Beacon Farm Market" window decals for business sponsors
- Monthly flyers at Dia:Beacon, parks, library, post office, retail food establishments and other Main Street businesses advertising what's in season at the Market and programming

Long-term:

- Obtain graphic design assistance (pro bono or discounted cost) to design Farm Market logo and consistent "look"
- Purchase advertising space in area publications (Edible Hudson Valley, Valley Table, Chronogram, Beacon Free Press, etc)
- Lighpost signs on Main Street advertising Farm Market
- Large Main Street banner during Winter season, when people often forget about Farm Market

7. PROPOSED BUDGET & COMPENSATION

Common Ground Farm is proposing an estimated monthly rent to the City of Beacon of \$100-200, based on initial estimates of the current revenues. All other financial transactions with vendors will be managed by CGF. Without knowing the details of the current revenues, the organization seeks to discuss and establish an agreement with the City, following the submission of this proposal.

City of Beacon Farmers Market License Agreement

This Agreement made as of the _____ day of February, 2016, by and between the City of Beacon (the "City"), a New York municipal corporation with offices at 1 Municipal Plaza, Beacon, New York 12508 ("City"), and Common Ground Farm, Inc. ("CGF"), a New York domestic not-for-profit corporation with offices at P.O. Box 443, Beacon, NY 12508.

WHEREAS, this Agreement sets forth the rights and obligations of the parties in connection with the operation of the Farmers Market.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and conditions contained herein, it is agreed as follows:

- 1. <u>Grant of License</u>. The City hereby grants CGF a license ("License") to operate the Farmers Market and its related activities and events within the City of Beacon at the location and times specified below.
- 2. <u>Term of License</u>. The term ("Term") of this Agreement shall be from March 1, 2016 to December 31, 2016.
- 3. <u>Location of Market</u>. CGF shall operate the Farmers Market at the Ferry Landing at the City of Beacon Waterfront on Sundays only from 8:00am to 4:00 pm, including setting up and breaking down. At its discretion, the City Administrator may permit the CGF to operate a Farmers Market in the Main Street business area upon such terms and at such location as determined by the City Administrator.
- 4. Operation of Market. CGF shall promote and advertise the Market. CGF shall operate and manage the Market in accordance with the CGF's Rules and Regulations, subject to any and all Federal, State and local laws having jurisdiction over CGF and the Farmers Market. A copy of the current rules and regulations shall be attached as an Exhibit to this Agreement, and CGF shall provide the City with updated rules and regulations as they are amended from time to time. CGF shall be solely responsible for the coordination and management of farmers, producers, and vendors. All Farmers Market participants (i.e. vendors, farmers, etc.) shall complete an indemnification agreement in favor of the City of Beacon and an application in the form annexed hereto.
- 5. Additional Activities Permitted. CGF may provide music, and noise shall be kept to a reasonable volume level in consideration of the proximity of other activities at the Waterfront and in accordance with the City's noise ordinance. Cooking demonstrations shall be permitted, provided propane tanks are properly secured and not left open to the public. Wine and beer tasting is permitted by vendors selling wine at Farmers Market where said vendors possess all required licenses. No open consumption of alcoholic beverages is otherwise permitted. CGF may also provide activities of interest to children.

- 6. <u>Products Sold.</u> CGF shall permit its vendors to sell only those products that are preapproved by CGF, or its designee.
- 7. <u>Cancellations</u>. The City reserves the right to suspend this License on any given scheduled market day when snow fall, hurricane, or other severe weather event renders the Licensed Area unsafe or unsuitable for use by the Farmers Market and the City cannot make the Licensed Area safe or suitable in time for use on the scheduled market day. The City shall incur no liability to the Farmers Market, its agents, vendors, invitees or employees, by exercising its right pursuant to this paragraph.
- 8. <u>License Fee.</u> A fee of \$200.00 per month that the Market is operated, without being pro rated, shall be paid quarterly.

9. Personnel and Equipment.

- (a) A Market Manager, or a designated representative of CGF will be present and supervising the Farmers Market, its vendors and activities during all hours of operation. CGF shall provide all necessary equipment to operate the Farmers Market.
- (b) Farmers Market participants shall be required to provide their own means of trash removal and shall not use any City receptacles for disposal of garbage or recyclables generated from their operation at the Farmers Market.
- (c) CGF acknowledges and represents that all personal property and equipment used for and in connection with the Farmers Market is owned or leased by CGF or its vendors. CGF shall indemnify and hold the City harmless against any and all claims or causes of action made by any person or entity, arising out of, or resulting from the rights to such personal property or equipment.
- 10. Within thirty (30) days of this Agreement being signed, CGF shall form a Farmer's Market Committee and provide the City's Recreation Director with the name, phone number and email address of the Committee members.

11. Insurance and Indemnity.

- (a) CGF will provide the City with evidence of all necessary insurance, as of the date hereof, which will include, at a minimum, General Liability Insurance in the sum of One Million and 00/100 (\$1,000,000.00) Dollars each occurrence and Two Million and 00/100 (\$2,000,000.00) Dollars annual aggregate. The City shall be named as an Additional Insured on said policies.
- (b) If CGF hires any employees during the term of this Agreement, it shall obtain statutorily required Workmen's Compensation Insurance.
- (c) CGF and the Market Manager shall indemnify and hold the City harmless against any and all claims or causes of action made by any person, arising out of, or resulting from the

operation of the Farmers Market arising out of any other alleged conduct of the CGF or its vendors in connection with the Farmers Market.

- (d) CGF shall cause the Market Manager to provide the City Clerk with (i) the original indemnification agreements obtained from each vendor; and (ii) copies of all certificates of insurance provided by each vendor to CGF.
- 12. <u>Conduct of CGF</u>. CGF and the Market Manager and their employees and vendors will at all times conduct business in a courteous and hospitable manner during operation of the Farmers Market.

13. Modifications and Notices.

- (a) Wherever in this Agreement notices are required to be delivered by one party to the other, then the same shall be in writing by first-class mail or personal delivery and addressed to the City at City Hall at 1 Municipal Plaza, Beacon, New York 12508, and to CGF at the address set forth above. Any modifications to this Agreement are required to be in writing and executed by both parties. This Agreement contains the entire understanding between the parties.

- 14. <u>Agreement Non-assignable</u>. The License granted hereunder and this Agreement, and the obligations and privileges conferred on CGF in this Agreement are not assignable by CGF without the City's prior written consent.
- 15. <u>Authorities</u>. CGF will secure all necessary permits, licenses and certificates from the appropriate regulatory agencies, including the City and the Dutchess County Department of Health, if any are required, and shall maintain compliance with all local, federal and state laws ("Government Approvals"). CGF will furnish all necessary documentation to the City, upon request, demonstrating compliance by it or its vendors with Government Approvals. CGF will keep accurate records of its enforcement of the Rules and Regulations, and acknowledges the right of the City to review its records for purposes of assuring continued compliance with Government Approvals, the Rules and Regulations, and the terms of this Agreement. All such records shall be made available for review by the City upon the City 's request upon reasonable notice.
- 16. <u>Maintenance</u>. CGF will keep the License Area in a clean and orderly condition at all times and will leave the License Area in broom clean condition and will remove all of its equipment by 4 p.m. of each Sunday during the Term.

17. Breach of Agreement.

(a) In the event that CGF fails to pay any fees due the City under this Agreement or otherwise breaches any of the terms of this Agreement, or if the Licensed Area is needed for a public purpose, then and in said event, and upon five (5) business days written notice to CGF, the City may

terminate this Agreement. The parties acknowledge that this Agreement is not a lease agreement and that the relationship between the parties is not a landlord/tenant relationship. The parties acknowledge that this Agreement is a license agreement between the parties which may be terminated pursuant to the terms herein.

(b) Further, upon such a breach and written notice as specified above, the City may, without further notice, peaceably re-enter the Licensed Area and dispossess CGF and remove its effects and hold the Licensed Area as if this Agreement had not been made. If CGF shall default prior to the commencement of any renewal of this Agreement, the City may cancel and terminate such renewal immediately by written notice.

Removal of Pre-Employment Screening Questions from Application Process

To advance the County Executive, Marcus Molinaro's efforts to ensure a more open and diverse workforce, Dutchess County will be removing pre-screening questions related to an individual's criminal history and other matters on County employment and examination applications. This practice, which is commonly known as "Ban the Box," promotes fairness and opportunity for all applicants by removing barriers that may impede otherwise qualified individuals from applying for employment. The "Ban the Box" practice does *not* eliminate the process of gathering information about an applicant's criminal history or employment dismissals as this information can be obtained at a later stage in the hiring process.

Effective February 1, 2016, the Dutchess County Department of Human Resources will discontinue use of questions about criminal history or employment dismissals on exam and recruitment application forms. Please see the other side of this page for a list of the questions being eliminated.

Implications for Dutchess County Departments

Dutchess County will remove questions about criminal or employment history from examination and employment applications. Upon a conditional offer of employment to a potential employee, Dutchess County will obtain the applicant's criminal and employment history, fingerprint record report, and any additional background/ history information required for a specific position, or for any position where it is mandated by statute or policy.

Implications for Appointing Authorities

Upon implementation of this change, appointing authorities will be solely responsible for performing pre-employment screening and background checks on applicants according to the policy of their agency. All appointing authorities should re-evaluate hiring policies and procedures to assure compliance with existing regulations and to align with this change in County policy. The County can provide technical assistance with developing application procedures to agencies upon request.
